How about different techniques for scientific work (e.g. literature review, organizing)? What is specific for social work in terms of participation and research ethics? The course / seminar proposes inputs, application of different working tools, communities of practice, and presentation of PhD students and their work. As much as possible PhD students should work and progress on their own project.
